



NORWALK ARTS CENTER

***When your life is over, the world will ask you only one question:
'Did you do what you were supposed to do?' – Korczak Ziolkowski.***

This quote is attributed to a self-taught sculptor, who was born in Boston of Polish decent and grew up in the foster care system after his parents died tragically when he was one. His gift to the world is still in progress even years after his death. I was fortunate enough to view his masterpiece in the making a few weeks ago when I was visiting the incredibly massive, but yet simply respectful Crazy Horse Memorial. As I stood there admiring the beauty of his work, it occurred to me that the human mind, body, soul and hands are an incredible combination; and that I have been surrounded by people like Korczak my whole life.



Art is in the hands of the mason who creates beautiful stone buildings. Art is in the mind and hands of the carpenter and his lathe. Art is in the beautiful meal a woman prepares for her family and the kaleidoscope of flowers she tends in her garden. Art is in the mind, hands and torch of the welder that liquifies metal to create a powerful source of strength. And finally, art is in the musician that serves as the foundation of beautiful songs. This is my family. I am incredibly fortunate to not only be a part of them, but to truly admire them for their gifts and their contributions over the years to everyone around them. I believe they've all done and are still doing what they've supposed to do.

So, you see, the impact of art is everywhere you go...

if you simply recognize it and be present in it. You have people all around you – your family, co-workers, friends, kids, grandkids – that have the ability to create art in some fashion. I believe it is up to all of us to make our area a better community by focusing on the arts, embracing them and letting them flourish. We need to encourage anyone we know that has an inkling of artistic talent to get involved somehow, somewhere to let them see the incredible potential inside themselves.

Norwalk Arts Center is a grassroots organization, in existence for only two years, that does just that. Our Arts Education programming and our Children, Teen and Adult Community Theatre focuses on all components of the arts – visual, music, dance and theatre. Our fundraising efforts to restore YOUR historic Norwalk Theater will allow our community to create art from its simplest to most diverse and complex forms.

Your help is needed in order to continue what we've started. Our programming and productions are steadily increasing in numbers and interest, even through COVID. Our volunteers are wonderful and are ready for more tasks to help spread our mission. Our ultimate goal is for you and your family, though. The doors at 57 E. Main Street, your historic theater, need to be opened in order to really escalate our vision for our future programming and education of the arts.

In order to do this, we need you! Our current phase in the restoration of the theater is the historic marquee. We are finalizing our budget with the State of Ohio to attain the \$250,000 grant allocated to NAC that will enable us to restore and upgrade the roof, lighting, sheet metal, plumbing and paint of just the marquee as well as qualify the building to be listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The architectural firm Perspectus will have the master design study finished in the next month. We can't wait to share it with you! From there, we continue to work on raising the necessary funding to start the interior work of the plumbing, heating, cooling and electrical through grants, fundraising and this . . . our annual appeal. Our goal this year is \$100,000. Your contribution is so very important to the mission of Norwalk Arts Center.







Arts Education is Key to Building a Supportive Community

The Arts Education Committee believes that every individual is an artist. Very often, the fear of failure or ridicule holds back true expression, so providing safe and inclusive environments to learn and create is vital to having a community in which the arts are both celebrated and supported.

By developing programs for all ages and abilities, Norwalk Arts Center is building that supportive community. The connections being formed from these efforts are not only broadening opportunities for individuals to learn about art but are also giving established artists an avenue through which to share their passion and showcase their art. These are the very building blocks of a thriving arts community.
