Big Changes On Norwalk Main Street

The main street of Norwalk, Ohio, looks a little different these days. The iconic Schine's Norwalk Theater is getting a facelift! The neon "NORWALK" signs that have been perched atop the marquee since 1941 were removed in late April. The temporary removal is part of the restoration of the former movie house to become the future home of Norwalk Arts Center (NAC).



"We are blessed to have many community members and business partners assisting in the process. The center

will be for the community when it is finished," said NAC Co-founder, Vanessa Cook. The organization, founded in 2018, aims to provide quality arts programming and entertainment in Huron County. Currently they are providing several arts programs in the community through outreach programs in satellite locations.

"The city, county and state have shown great support for this endeavor. We are truly humbled," continued Cook. Partial funding for the project was made possible by the State of Ohio Cultural Facilities Grant. Phase One of the project included complete tear off and replacement of the main roof, ceiling removal, and environmental hazard remediation.

The final part of Phase One is repairing and restoring the original marquee. As an anchor for the east end of Main Street, the illuminated marquee will welcome visitors to the small rural community in north central Ohio. The signs will get refaced and upgraded with energy efficient LED lighting that replicates the neon and incandescent bulbs. After that the "NORWALK" signs will be returned to their original location.


