Norwalk theater paintings surveyed. This spring, NAC was selected to receive a 2022 subsidized survey by ICA Art Conservation. The Cleveland firm sent out a painting conservator to open areas of the mural, lobby ceiling and balcony lobby floor to determine color schemes and patterns that were original to the theater in 1941. "Through research we found during this period of Art Deco Streamline Moderne, Eberson used paint to embellish the interiors of his theaters. It was a departure from his very ornate atmospheric design, with gold gilding and ornate plaster work", said Vanessa Cook, NAC co-founder.

"It is very important to us to try and replicate what we are able, to really give this gem the attention it deserves." The survey which could cost upwards to \$4600.00 was completed for less than a ¼ of that cost with the subsidy. As part of their ongoing public service each year ICA-Art Conservation selects a few institutions annually to receive a subsidized survey. The goal of the program is to help the recipient institution identify its preservation needs and plan future conservation and stewardship initiatives. The information gained through the assessment helps the institution prioritize objectives and potentially raise funds to address those preservation needs.

First Annual Volunteer Appreciation Night

On April 24, 2023, NAC held its First Annual Volunteer Appreciation Night. The purpose of the evening was to thank and recognize our volunteers for their involvement. Volunteers were treated to desserts and gifts. They also learned about the history of our non-profit, plans for the restoration of the historic Norwalk Theater, information about productions/education programming, and how NAC is funded.

There are several reasons that people volunteer; helping others to support a common cause, having an interest in the cause, to gain experience, seeing a need in the community, or having time available. Every month since then, adults in our area have had the opportunity to participate in workshops taught by guest artists in a format that encourages creativity and community.



Guest artists have shared their passion and expertise in a wide variety of art forms, such as mixed media, journaling, macrame, and mandala rock painting. Held at local venues like Common Good



Collective and Norwalk Area Chamber of Commerce, participants have enjoyed fun, fellowship, and favorite libations as they learned a new art form and made new friends.

Cassie Shella, chairperson of the Discover Your NAC subcommittee, says the goal is to offer some kind of adult arts education workshop once a month. "We want our workshops to be appealing and affordable," Shella added. "Everyone
